


Balade au cerf-volant

MADE FROM A THREE-TONNE BLOCK OF SOIGNIES STONE, THIS SCULPTURE SHOWS THREE FIGURES CLIMBING A HILL WHERE THE WIND HAS PICKED UP. AT THE TOP, THE CHILD CLUTCHING HIS MOTHER SEEMS IMPATIENT TO LAUNCH HIS KITE. THE PURE FORMS AND ANGULAR FACES UNDERLINE THE POWER OF THE WIND.

THE SCULPTURE WAS CREATED DURING THE SYMPOSIUM OF STONE, HELD IN FRESSIN IN 2013 ON THE THEME OF « A FAMILY IN THE WIND », IN A TRIBUTE TO AEOLUS, THE GOD OF THE WINDS IN GREEK MYTHOLOGY AND TO THE PEOPLE OF OUR RURAL AREA. A SCULPTURE COMPETITION TOOK PLACE DURING THIS EVENT.
